Iris June (Daily) Murphy, 91, of Alliance, died on March 10, 2013, at 12:30 a.m. at her daughter's home in Marion, Indiana. She was born on December 3, 1922 in North Canton, was a 1940 graduate of Jackson Township High School, and lived in the North Canton and Alliance areas all of her life. She was the owner of the People's Book Store in Alliance and had been previously employed at Danbury of North Canton. Iris was a member of the Alliance Friends Church since 1948 and had served as a Sunday School Teacher, Women's Missionary President, was on the Friends Church Missions Board for 27 years, and had served in many other capacities in the church. Mrs. Murphy and her late husband, Lee, worked with Bible's Foundation World Distribution and sent out over 15,000 Bibles to 56 countries. She is survived by her daughter, Peggy (Steve) Stewart of Marion, IN; a son, Ted Murphy of Massillon; three granddaughters, Melissa (Mike) Anderson of Alliance, Tara Stewart of Marion, IN, and Marci (Mark) Burke of Marion, IN; two grandsons, Steve (Dannielle) Murphy of Brunswick, and Matt Murphy of Louisville; 10 great-grandchildren; daughter-in-law, Chris Murphy of Alliance; two sisters, Betty Taylor of Middlebranch, and Donna Nagle of Greentown; and many nieces, nephews and friends. Preceding her in death was her husband, Lee Murphy on January 10, 2002, whom she married on October 3, 1941; and her parents, Ivan and Ruth (Martin) Daily. Funeral services will be held at Pleasant Valley Cemetery in North Canton on Friday, March 14, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. with Rev. Rick Sams of Alliance Friends Church, officiating. Interment will
