



Wilbur Cody Dixson

August 21, 1925 - September 6, 2002

Wilbur Cody "Will" Dixson, 77, of Cuyahoga Falls, died on Friday, September 06, 2002 at 8:05 a.m. at Akron General Hospital after putting up a courageous battle against Parkinson Disease for 14 years. Born in Alliance on August 21, 1925, he was a direct descendant of Joshua Dixson, Revolutionary War Soldier and Founder of the city of Columbiana, Ohio. An Alliance High School graduate of the class of June 1943, he attended Kent State Stark Campus. Serving 33 months in the U.S. Navy, he was stationed in Alameda California Naval Air Station during WWII. Mr. Dixson was the Western District Sales Manager for Food Ingredients Division of Hercules Inc. of Wilmington, DE. He was a member of the Alliance American Legion Post 166, the Lafayette Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution and the Scottish Heritage St. Andrews Society of San Francisco, CA. He was a former member of the Alliance B.P.O. Elks, the Cuyahoga Falls Blue Lodge Masonic Order and the Tadmor Shrine Temple of Akron. Survivors include his wife of 52 years, Charlene (Sponseller) Dixson; twin daughters, Susan Lee (Brian) Borrell of Norton and Sandra Lynn (Tom) Froelich of Cuyahoga Falls; a granddaughter, Kathleen Anne Borrell; five step grandchildren, Adam, Justin, Scott, Tommy and Caitlynn; a sister, Mrs. Joy E. Ferguson of Alliance; a brother, Eugene E. Dixson of Salem; and several nieces and nephews. Preceding him in death are his parents, Wilbur C. and Eva M. (Philbrick) Dixson; and two brothers, Blann C. Dixson and Paul B. Dixson. Memorial services will be held at Walton-Schrader Funeral Home on Monday at 2:00 p.m., with Pastor Tim Roeser of

the Barberton Baptist Temple, officiating. A remembrance visitation will be held at the funeral home on Monday from 1:00 – 2:00 p.m. Burial will take place at a later date in Fairmount Memorial Park.
